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The two options explained

Whilst we anticipate that child-focused mediation is suitable for children younger than 5 years of age and child-inclusive mediation is suitable for children over 5 years of age, we will be responsive to each child and family and tailor our service to the developmental and family needs of each matter.

The process

- Step 1: Referral of matter to Clark & Associates Mediation Services.
- Step 2: Each parent participates in individual, confidential intake sessions with the Mediator.
- Step 3: Information package and child expert forms provided to each parent.
- Step 4: Each parent participates in a further intake session with the Child Expert.
- Step 5: If the matter is deemed suitable to be child-inclusive each child meets with the Child Expert to participate in age appropriate, relaxed, play-therapy-style assessment and interview;

... or ...

If the matter is not suitable to be child-inclusive the matter progresses on a child-focused basis. It may be possible for play-therapy-style observations of each child to be made with each parent.

- Step 6: The Mediator, Child Expert and both parents attend mediation. Children do not attend the mediation itself.
- Step 7: If the matter is child-inclusive: The Mediator facilitates the mediation and consistently invites the parents to consider and focus on the best interests of their child/ren having regard to the views of the child/ren and their developmental needs.

The Child Expert carefully conveys to the parents the issues which emerged during assessment with the child/ren and provides input into how arrangements could be made to meet their needs.

...or...



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If the matter is child-focused: The Mediator facilitates the mediation and consistently invites the parents to consider and focus on the best interests of their child/ren having regard to their developmental needs based on theory and their age.

The Child Expert provides information about developmental theory and the needs of children based on their developmental age.

In summary the process:

- Facilitates the involvement of children in dispute resolution via assessment of their experiences;
- Provides them with an opportunity to be heard in an age appropriate manner;
- Allows core themes from assessment to be incorporated into negotiations;
- Introduces current and intimate material into the dispute resolution process;
- Considers the developmental needs of children in any agreement reached.

Our fees for child-focused and child-inclusive mediations cover the services provided by both the Mediator and Child Expert.

As at January 2021 they are as follows:-

- Full-Day (8 hour) child-focused mediation: \$5,500 (inclusive of GST);
- Full-Day (8 hour) child-inclusive mediation: \$5,500 (inclusive of GST);
- If further time is required on the day: \$330 per hour (inclusive of GST);
- Room hire (at cost), Buderim Rooms are without cost.

Why would parents consider these options?

Research has shown that child-inclusive and child-focused interventions in Family Dispute Resolution Mediation can result in the following immediate effects:

- Children report positive outcomes for the family;
- Children's emotional responses improve;
- Reduction in conflict;
- Parents report improvement in dispute management;
- Parents are more satisfied with the arrangements agreed on; and
- Agreements were more durable and workable.
